

High School Secretary Sarah Sills



Veterans Game





Eagle Fitness Questions & Answers

What is the status of the new Eagle Fitness Center facility?

The Eagle Fitness Center is officially open, and will be accepting rentals, reservations, and memberships.

When will school and community groups begin to use the fitness center?

Starting on September 6, 2023, the facility will officially be open for use in a couple of different manners. One will be as a paying member of the facility. The other option will be through a rental/reservation of the spaces. Keep in mind that there are some times that are closed specifically for school-related items.

How can I rent or reserve the new recreation gym, or any of our other gyms for that matter?

Rentals and reservations can be done by submitting the Eagle Facility Rental Request Form online. Processing of your request could take up to a couple of days.

When will individual memberships be available for the Eagle Fitness Center for use of the cardio room, weight room, or track?

Eagle Fitness Memberships are officially open as of September 6, 2023. You can request a membership by filling out the Eagle Fitness Membership Request Form online. Processing of your request could take up to a couple of days.

What are the rental reservation and membership rates for using the fitness center and our gyms?

The rates have been set by the School Board, and can be found on our website.

Why is there any cost at all for using these facilities when taxpayers have already paid to build the facility?

We absolutely appreciate the support our community members and taxpayers have provided in passing the millage and enabling the construction of our beautiful new facility. As shared prior to the mileage election, membership rates and facility use rental fees are needed to offset the ongoing costs of utilities, maintenance, equipment replacement, and staffing for community use so that it does not direct funds away from student programs. Since the community has already paid for the construction of the facility, our membership rates are less than half of those typically paid at private gyms and fitness centers, and the rental rates are set on the low end of those charged and other local school districts. Nonresidents will also have opportunities to use our facilities, but will pay a higher rate.

How will the scheduling of our facilities be prioritized among the many potential groups and users?

As has always been our practice in scheduling our facilities, we will generally schedule school teams and school sponsored groups first, groups made up primarily of district residents second, and groups made up fully or primarily of non-residents third.

Eagle Fitness Questions & Answers Continued

What days and hours will the fitness center and gyms be available for use?

Hours of operations can be found on the fitness center website. It should be noted that with opening memberships, there will no longer be drop in or staffed hours.

What safety and security measures will be in place, especially if the fitness center is available during school hours?

Eagle Fitness Members that use the facility during the school day are required to submit to a background check. It is the same background check we currently use for school volunteers. We are also using a punch pad system with an individual code assigned to each member and renter for entry into the fitness center limiting access to only those who have had the background check. The portion of the building typically available to fitness club members and daytime gym users are the weight room, cardio room, track and recreational gym. The three sets of doors that separate the athletic center from the rest of the school building are set to alarm should fitness centers users pass through them during the school day. All areas of the fitness center are monitored with security cameras.

Have all the details been worked out to assure that the fitness center and facilities use plans will work perfectly moving forward?

Absolutely not! While we have a clear vision that we want to make our facilities readily available to our community, and an initial plan to get that use underway, we know that there will be issues that arise that have to be worked out along the way. Just like building our new facility had a simple, black and white blueprint for its construction. There were many, many adjustments made during the process to improve and adjust those initial plans resulting in an improved, outstanding facility. The same will be true for our work to fill the new facility with programs, activities, and opportunities that meet the needs of our kids and community. The information contained in this Q&A is an overview of that initial plan. Many more details have been considered and others will continue to emerge. We are happy to get this facility open to our community and ask for your continued patience as we refine our processes to fulfill our mission to meet our student and community needs.

Legal Notices

BOARD POLICY ON MEDICATIONS

Before any medication or treatment may be administered to any student during school hours, the board shall require the written prescription from the child's physician accompanied by the written authorization of the parent. In cases where non-prescribed medication is necessary, the school may dispense such medication only upon proper authorization by the parent. These documents shall be on file in the principal's office.

Only medication in its original prescription bottle, labeled with the date of the prescription, student's name, and exact dosage will be administered. Staff of students authorized in writing by their physician and parents may administer medication or treatment, but only in the presence of another adult.

In cases where non-prescribed medications are necessary, the school may dispense such medication only upon the proper authorization by the parents.

Staff members are to administer medication or treatment only in the presence of another adult, except in the case of an emergency that threatens the life or health of the student.

Civil Rights, Title VI, and Section 504 – Non-Discrimination Policy

As required by the federal government, the following notices are given to the community of Fowler Public Schools:

Civil Rights Compliance - The Fowler Public Schools, located at 700 S. Main St. Fowler, MI 48835 & 11214 W. Kent St. Fowler, MI 48835, will receive and use federal funds and USDA donated foods. No person, because of race, color, national origin, sex, age or handicap, shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subject to discrimination in our United States Department of Agriculture donated food and child nutrition programs.

Non-Discrimination Policy – It is the policy of Fowler Public Schools that no person shall, on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin or ancestry, sex, age, disability, height, weight, or marital status, be excluded from participation in, or be subjected to discrimination during any program, activity, or employment.

COMMUNICATION PROCESS

Questions, concerns and ideas routinely arise during the school year. This outline is provided to assist in communication with the appropriate person.

Step 1: Questions or concerns regarding instructional practices should go to the teacher first. A discussion should be scheduled with the principal if you still have questions after talking with the teacher.

Step 2: Questions or concerns should be directed to the administrator or director who has responsibility in the area of concern.

Step 3: A conference with the superintendent is most appropriately held if questions or concerns have not been adequately addressed at earlier levels.

Step 4: The final level of contact with the district about a question or concern is the Board of Education.

COMPLAINT/GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Grievance/Complaint Procedures of the Title VI and Title IX of the Education Amendment Act of 1972 and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973:

If any person believes that the Fowler Public School District, or any part of the school, has inadequately applied the principles and/or regulations of (1) Title VI of the Education Amendment Act of 1972, and (3) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, he/she may bring forward a complaint, to the local Civil Rights Coordinator, Patrick O'Rourke, Fowler Public Schools, 700 S. Main Street, Fowler, MI 48835 & 11214 W. Kent St, Fowler MI, 48835.

The person who believes he/she has a valid basis for the complaint shall discuss the complaint informally with the local Civil Rights Coordinator. If unresolved, he/she may initiate formal procedures according to the following steps:

Step 1: A written statement of the complaint signed by the complainant shall be submitted to the local Civil Rights Coordinator.

Step 2: The coordinator shall further investigate the complaint and reply in writing to the complainant.

Step 3: If the complainant wishes to appeal the decision of the local Civil Rights Coordinator, he/she may submit a signed statement of appeal to the superintendent within (10) calendar days after receipt of the coordinator's response.

Step 4: The superintendent shall affirm or reverse the Civil Rights Coordinator's decision and, if warranted, implement the Civil Rights Coordinator's proposed resolution or a modification there of.

Step 5: If the complainant remains unsatisfied, he/she may appeal to the Office for Civil Rights, Department of Education, Washington DC 20202.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

Section 444 of the General Education Provisions Act is commonly referred to as The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act 20 U.S.C. 1232g (FERPA) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education. FERPA generally does not apply to most private elementary and secondary schools, as they do not typically receive U.S. Department of Education funding.

The educational interests of students require the collection, retention, and use of data about individuals and groups of students while ensuring individual rights of privacy. The school District will maintain educational records of students for legitimate educational purposes.

School records are confidential and information from them shall not be released except as provided by law. The information contained in school student records shall be kept current, accurate, clear, and relevant. The District may release directory information in accord with law, provided parent(s)/guardian(s) are given the opportunity to object to the release of this information. Directory information for this District includes the following information: the student's name, picture, major field of study, participation in recognized activities and sports and related information, grade placement, honors and awards received, and telephone number (for military recruiters only).

Directory information may be provided to persons or organizations for non-profit making purposes when deemed appropriate by the building principal, unless the parents of the student restrict the information in writing to the building principal.

The District shall inform students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) annually and upon initial enrollment of their rights under FERPA and Board policy with respect to student records, and of the procedures for exercising those rights. The Superintendent shall provide the appropriate training to all staff that has access to student records.

Pursuant to federal law, a form will be sent to parent(s)/guardian(s) that allow them to opt out of the disclosure of directory information to the military recruiters, and that informs the recipients that failure to complete and return the form will result in the disclosure of the information to military recruiters.

As provided in PA39, 2002 (MCL 380.1139) a school must provide armed forces recruiters and service academies with a student's name, address, and telephone number (if listed.)

The District shall protect the rights of privacy of students and their families in connection with any surveys or data-gathering activities conducted, assisted, or authorized by the Board or Superintendent.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

The following is a description of the immunization requirements as set by the Department of Education and the Department of Public Health.

- 1. Ages 4-6: 4 doses of DTP or D Tap (one dose must be on or after age 4); 4 doses of polio vaccine; 2 doses MMR vaccine on or after 12 months of age; 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine on or after 12 months of age OR reliable history of disease.
- 2. Ages 7-18, including all 6th graders: 4 doses D and T OR 3 doses Td if one given on or after age 7; 1 dose Tdap for ages 11-18 IF 5 years since the last dose of tetanus/diphtheria vaccine; 2 doses MMR; 3 doses Hepatitis B; 1 dose meningococcal for ages 11 or older upon entry into 7th grade or higher; 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine OR reliable history of dis-ease.

Current laboratory evidence of immunity is acceptable instead of immunization with antigen. All doses must be given with appropriate spacing and at appropriate ages. Tdap is required at 11 years of age or older regardless of grade.

When presented with anything but a medical or religious exemption from immunization requirements, the administrator must obtain the consent of the director of local public health office to recognize the exemption and admit the student. All parents are encouraged to review their child's immunization record. If records do not meet the requirements, please contact your family physician or the local department of public health.

INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT PLAN (IPM)

The use of pesticides in schools must be done in accordance with an Integrated Pest Management Program which complies with Regulation 637, Rule 14 of the Michigan Pesticide Act, PA 171. The Fowler district IPM plan is in accordance with the state law and available to the public by requesting a copy from the superintendent's office. Each school building has a copy for reference for interested staff and students.

In brief, the IPM plan clearly defines the procedures necessary to apply pest control methods of school. The applicant must use the following checklist:

- 1. Site evaluation
- 2. Inspection
- 3. Monitoring
- 4. Determine pest biology
- 5. Consider all available methods
- 6. Take action steps

Over the course of the school year, during appropriate application times, the maintenance department may apply a variety of pest control methods. If you live in close proximity of the school and wish to be notified of any applications, contact the superintendent's office at 989-593-2296 as soon as possible.

MCKINNEY-VENTO ACT

The McKinney-Vento program is designed to address the problems that homeless children and youth have faced in enrolling, attending, and succeeding in school. Under this program, State educational agencies (SEAs) must ensure that each homeless child and youth has equal access to the same free, appropriate public education, including a public preschool education, as other children and youth.

The program is authorized under Title VII-B of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 USC 11431 et seq.), (McKinney-Vento Act). The program was originally authorized in 1987 and, most recently, reauthorized by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.

NOTIFICATION OF DESIGNATED EMPLOYEE AS TITLE VI, TITLE IX, AND SECTION 504 COORDINATOR

The federal government has made provisions to ensure that no person is discriminated against on the basis of sex, religion, race, color, national origin, age, height, weight, marital status or handicap. In order to protect these rights and assure compliance, the Fowler Public Schools has appointed as Patrick O'Rourke as Coordinator of Title VI, Title IX, and Section 504.

NOTICE TO PARENTS ABOUT HUMAN SEXUALITY AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH CURRICULUM

The Board of Education has established a program of instruction in sex education. As a component of the sex education program, reproductive health is offered in identified courses.

According to law (PA 226 of 1977), parents have the right to review the materials to be used in these courses. The local board of education, in compliance with state statute, will make the materials available for parents to re-view. Any parent who wishes to do so may contact the high school at 989-593-2250 or Waldron at 989-593-2160 to make arrangements for review of the materials.

Students in grades 4-9 will be eligible to participate in these courses. By law, parents have the right to excuse their children from participation in the reproductive health portion of the class.

Any parent wishing to exercise his/her right to excuse a student without penalty from instruction in reproductive health should please send written notice to Waldron Elementary or Fowler High School, PO Box 408, Fowler, MI 48835 before the scheduled instruction time.

PERSONALLY, IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION

Public Law 93.390 states: "An education agency or institution may disclose personally identifiable information from the educational records of a student who is in attendance at the institution or agency if that information has been designated as directory information." (45CFR 99.37(a)).

Accordingly, the following is designated as directory information with respect to all past and present students of the Fowler Public Schools:

- 1. Name
- 2. Participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- 3. Dates of attendance
- 4. Honors and rewards received
- 5. The most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student
- 6. Yearbook pictures and school related photographs

If you as a parent do not want this type of personally identifiable information made part of publicity, newsletters, yearbooks, and newspaper publications, please send a letter of notification designating the specific categories of directory information you do not want released with respect to your child.

In accordance with this law, a parent of a student currently in attendance in the Fowler Public Schools has ten (10) days from the date of this notice to notify the school district in writing.

TOBACCO USE PROHIBITED

Michigan law prohibits smoking in all buildings owned by public schools around the state. This includes not only the classroom buildings, but also any other buildings such as bus garages, maintenance buildings, or administrative buildings.
