



Secondary MTSS Update

In February, our Secondary Leadership Team met to review attendance, behavior, course performance, and overall engagement of our students as we started the 2023–2024 school year. We have so many wonderful things to celebrate!

Celebrations

At the end of 2nd Quarter:

- 88% of middle school students and 84% of high school students are on track for overall engagement (attendance, behavior, and passing core classes). All grades 5 through 12 met our school wide goal of 80% on this measure!
- 91% of high school students and 93% of middle school students attended 90% of instruction.
- All grades are on track for positive behavior.
- 88% of high school students and 95% of middle school students passed core classes.
- Grades 7 and 8 showed significant improvement in reading scores from fall to winter testing.
- Middle school grades completed their first round of NWFA math assessments.

Opportunities for Growth

As a secondary team, we plan to continue our work on goals related to attendance and reading, but have also set a goal to improve our math performance across the district. This will involve some collaboration among our K-12 math teachers and implementation of new benchmark assessments (NWEA) that will help inform instruction in math.

Second grade has been on a mission to spread love and cheer throughout February.





After the activities, Mrs. Carrey discussed with the students the proper technique to wash their hands. They washed their hands and put them under a black light to see if they followed the hand washing techniques. This lesson is similar to lessons that surgeons and other medical professions learn.




Appreciation Weeks


