Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2024-2025 educational progress for Fowler High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact me for assistance.

For the 2024-2025 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was NOT identified with one of the underperforming labels.

Fowler High School continues to work with the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP) using data to help make our programming decisions. We also have implemented a Multi-tiered System of Supports (MTSS) which includes rewarding positive behavior, attendance and academic success. Our most recent testing data shows our students scored in the top 50% of schools in math proficiency and the top 10% in reading proficiency. Fowler High School is within the top 30% of all schools in Michigan for overall testing rank.

Process for assigning pupils to a school:

Fowler High School is the only school serving ninth through twelfth grade students attending Fowler Public Schools; therefore, all students in those grades are assigned to Fowler High School.

The Status of the 3-5 Year School Improvement Plan:

The school improvement plan is focused around ensuring that students are proficient in both reading and math. We are continually working towards this goal through the use of state-wide testing data and local data. The plan also focuses on increasing attendance rates at school through various avenues.

Specialized School:

Fowler High School is not listed as a specialized school.

Parent Participation:

Fowler High School conducts parent-teacher conferences once a year. In the 2024-2025 school year, the average numbers of students represented at Fall conferences was 57, which equates to 33% of the total student population. In the 2023-2024 school year, the average numbers of students represented at Fall conferences was 30, which equates to 19% of the total student population. In the 2025-2026 school year, the average number of students represented at each conference was 35 which equates to 23% of the total student population. Electronic access to student progress and the ability to email a teacher at any time appears to have an impact on the number of parents physically showing up to conferences.

College Credit for Dual Enrollment:

Fowler High School participates in an enhanced dual enrollment program with Lansing Community College that allows students to earn college credit while also earning credit at FHS. Fall of 2024 had 76 students enrolled while Spring of 2025 had 76 students. These students completed an astounding 800 college credits during the 2024-2025 school year saving an estimated \$187,000 in college tuition expenses.

Advanced Placement Courses:

Fowler High School offers one advanced placement course in the building which is AP Calculus. During the past 3 school years, FHS averaged 8 students in this class. In 2025, 87.5% earned a score of 3+. Many of these students obtained college credit in multiple classes in our dual enrollment program.

Fowler High School is a comprehensive high school with rich traditions in academics, athletics and activities. Our programs and activities are designed to offer students opportunities to enrich their lives for many years to come. The faculty and staff believe that a child's education is a partnership with school, home and community. Parent and community participation is encouraged and appreciated. Our goal is to have every student leave our school as a well prepared lifelong learner. We appreciate the support of our parents and community as we work together to help our children grow. Thank you to all of the parents/guardians and our community for your generous support of Fowler High School.
